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FROM THE PRESIDENT

With all the work on improvements to our facilities, it is hard to be patient. It seems like half of the tennis complex has been completed for a long time. Now this month the other half is scheduled to be completed. We've had a tremendous amount of participation on the new courts and pickleball has been a particular hit with members young and old. I believe it is important with such accomplishments that we savor the success and celebrate. This is not just a celebration for Tennis staff, the Tennis Committee and tennis players, but something that all members should be proud to have been a contributor. As with Fitness, each accomplishment makes the Club a better experience for everyone and a more vibrant place to be.

Through the summer, records are being broken with attendance at the Fitness Center, in the Galley, summer camps and member dining.

We have also had an exciting number of new members join. I would like to encourage you to greet people you may not know so that families who are new to the Club know that they are

entering a welcoming friendly community. That's not an insincere gesture, it is who we are. I also believe that our members are some of the more interesting people in Norfolk. When you peel a layer back in conversation I think you will find some wonderful stories that help us remember names and find common ground.

As I mentioned previously, the Board is promoting a culture of change and we will continue to have additional projects for some years to come. This will require additional patience. You can expect announcements soon about our next phase of capital improvements that will focus on the main clubhouse.

I want to thank each of you for your support of these efforts. I promise that it will make our club a destination for your family and friends.

FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Mid-year financial results are in and the club is overall \$14,000 positive to budget through the first half of 2019. Dues income and initiation fee revenue have been strong as nearly 90 new and reinstated memberships have been added this year (we stand currently at 1,140 memberships). Junior Sailing is also enjoying very good numbers amid record attendance at sailing camps, programs and clinics. Kudos to the Jr. Sailing Committee for their leadership and commitment to grow sailing at Norfolk Yacht.

On the flip side, food and beverage (F&B) net income is (\$17k) unfavorable to budget YTD, which is actually very good given sales are (\$132k) short of budget and (\$160k) less when compared to 2018. Private banquet sales have not come in as planned thus far, however, good expense control on both labor and food costs have helped to keep the bottom line within 1.5% of budget. Average member F&B spending is up 6.5% this year which is also a positive sign. Thank you!

The management team does not just sit back and watch results; we plan for needed adjustments in the future to keep us on track. To do so, each month we update a forecast for the balance of the year. We run a model that includes results-to-date plus what we expect to occur moving forward, like known banquet

bookings and growth in racquet sports revenue. I am feeling pretty good about 2019 since the current forecast model shows the club to be \$56k favorable to budget at year end.

Besides dining at the club more, another way you can help improve financial performance is to opt out of a paper statement and go fully Online. Currently about 65% of members receive their statement and newsletter electronically. It costs about \$15 per year to process a paper statement for each member, which can add up to \$6,000 for those members still receiving mailings on an annual basis. Going paperless is easy – just call or email Suzanne Lyons in our accounting office. Please know, we will gladly see that your newsletter and statement continue to land in your mailbox as long as you like.

As a reminder, summary financial results, including the aforementioned forecast, are available to any interested member in a binder at the clubhouse front desk and on the club website.

I hope to see you at the club in August as there is a lot going on socially. See page 3 for upcoming events and details.

THREE GENERATIONS SET SAIL FOR BERMUDA

Richard Walker, sons Mark and David and grandson Chase recently sailed to Bermuda aboard *Wind Walker*.

They departed on Richard's 42 Catalina June 1 and returned to Pier C at the club June 18. The adventure covered about 1,300 nautical miles.

Richard, a navigator aboard two ships that saw just about every kind of weather condition during his Navy days and a self-described "blue water" sailor, headed the adventure. Everyone aboard stood 4-hour watches at the helm in a life jacket, harness and tether for safety.

The "Boys" spent 6 days going, 6 days in Hamilton at the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club and 6 days coming back to Norfolk.

The trip grew out of Richard's desire to spend time with his sons and grandson and show them Bermuda which he first visited 40 years ago.

"It was a great trip (from both standpoints)," he said. "Bermuda is a lot the same as it was, but much more expensive. The people are very friendly. If you ask them where to get groceries or a shirt, they don't just show you. They take you there."

They also explored the two theories regarding the "gunpowder incident" of the Revolutionary War when American patriots and Bermuda supporters brokered a deal supplying the

American troops with gunpowder in exchange for Americans not blockading British Bermuda. And visited other tourist sites and enjoyed eating the local cuisine.

The trip wasn't always smooth as glass. The *Wind Walker* ran into some storms on the way down and then the wind died just before reaching Bermuda.

On the way back, about 200 miles from Norfolk, they encountered a "microblast" (a severe, localized storm) that broke the half-inch thick genoa, tore a slit in the genoa hole in a sail and broke the slides out of the mainsail.

Later, some questionable diesel purchased in Bermuda caused a filter to clog and the engine to die. Walker changed the filter and they motored on to NYCC without incident.

"It's all a part of sailing," said Walker, a retired engineering manager with Jefferson Lab and an NYCC member since 1994.

Richard praised his inexperienced crew for not missing a watch. "They were primarily interested in what our meals on board would be," he said with a laugh, "but they did a great job."

The senior Walker said everyone was glad to get home. While another trip is not yet in the works, Richard says "everyone is game."

FACILITIES ENHANCEMENT PLAN

About ten months have passed since the membership voted and approved the Facilities Enhancement Plan proposed by the Board of Governors. So far, improvements have been made to our fitness equipment, indoor pool, poolside café, pool bathrooms, racquet sports complex, and piers. But there's still much work to be done, including the clubhouse. Renovations are expected to begin in 2020. Here's a brief outline of the plans for the clubhouse:

- Requests For Proposals (RFP) to design firms, September 2019
- House Committee formed, begin work in August
- Design Firm recommendation to Board by October 15

- Ensure club and private events are not impacted
- See that clubhouse bar & dining are always available somewhere
- The Deck renovation - likely first work area (date to be determined)

CLUBHOUSE RENOVATIONS

- Energy / infrastructure system upgrades
- New Adult Dining in former Main Dining Room
 - The 1896 Grille
 - Upscale casual dining and bar
- Enlarged outdoor dining area with fire features for year-round use
- Renovations to clubhouse main foyer
 - Entrance, handicap lift, reception
- Clubhouse redecorated throughout
 - New paint, wall coverings, window treatments, carpet, furniture, etc.
- Target date to be determined; likely May-September '20; Jan-March '21

FAMILY FISHING DAY CELEBRATES 25 YEARS

Every year John Vellines will get a call from a club member asking “When’s Family Fishing Day? We are trying to plan our vacation and don’t want to be away and miss it.”

This year FFD, one of NYCC’s most treasured traditions, is August 17th. Lines go in the water at 9:30. Hamburgers, hot dogs, keg beer for adults and fishing awards follow.

It all started in 1994 when Vellines became Fleet Captain of Sport Fishing and thought “I gotta do something” and came up with the idea of holding a fishing tournament for kids.

Every year since, some 70-100 members, many who fished as kids and are now bringing their children, and guests show up for what has morphed into Family Fishing Day.

Members like 78-year-old Cece Turrietta who first came when her granddaughters were young and fell in love with fishing. She comes by herself these days and still throws a line in the water, but mainly teaches youngsters who are fishing for the first time. Then there’s Jack Copeland, who started fishing at FFD when he was 3. Now a teenager, he’s still coming.

As the Vellines family can attest, nothing bonds a family like fishing. There are four generations of the clan involved in FFD.

Great Grandpa Jack, a still spry 93, who helps newbies bait their hooks and weighs

the catches, John’s wife Stacey, who handles registration and works hard to make sure there’s a category for every trophy, John Jr. who manages the waterfront and sees to it that everyone is catching “something” and having a good time. His two boys – Jack, 5, and Gibby, 3, do the family fishing.

Sometimes, John’s sister, Claire, or daughter, Erin, show up to help. And there are faithful volunteers, like Jack Council, who has been an integral part of FFD since the beginning and plans on being on hand for the 25th year.

Over the years, just about everything has been pulled out of the water from sharks, rays, crabs, tree branches, lost fishing poles. It’s led

to such awards for *Most Unusual Catch*, *Ugliest Fish*, and *Smallest Fish*.

“We’ll find a category for everyone,” said Stacey Vellines. And John Vellines is quick to add, “We’ve only had one person fall into the water in all the years. I think why it has lasted so long is that it’s just a fun day and it’s a great learning experience for kids and parents.”

“The neatest thing is seeing how excited the kids get and the look on their faces when they catch a fish or get trophy,” said Stacey Vellines.

John Vellines, who is turning over more responsibilities to his son, expects Family Fishing Day to continue, well, “for as long as members keep having kids.”

 2. Trade the NYCC burgee for a burgee from the yacht club you’re visiting. If you can, please photograph the “burgee swap” and email your photo to Communications Coordinator Leigh Knowles at lknowles@norfolkyacht.com.
 3. Upon your return, bring the burgee you collected to the front desk of NYCC’s clubhouse. The member’s account will be credited for the prior amount charged.

WHATEVER FLOATS YOUR BOAT

JetDocks are now available at NYCC! You can check out the club's first one at slip #9 on B Pier lifting up Amy and Andy McGraw's Boston Whaler.

JetDocks keep boats out of the water when they are not being used. So, there's no barnacles to deal with and no need for bottom paint. They come with a lifetime warranty and are less expensive and quicker to install than traditional boat lifts. They are designed for outboard, inboard/outboard and jet drive crafts up to 23-feet and 5,000 pounds.

The Board of Directors has approved two options. Members may either buy a JetDock outright (which they could either sell or

move if they choose) and pay a flat monthly slip fee. Or they can opt to make a non-refundable deposit, sign a minimum 3-year lease and pay a slightly higher monthly slip fee.

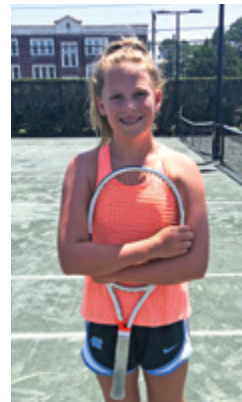
