e begin our new fiscal year the first V of February with good momentum towards the transformation of our Club. Most of the deferred maintenance items are completed including several mechanical units that required replacement, some as old as 30 years. We begin the bunker replacement project this month. Daniel Robbins

aniel Robbins grew up in Virginia Beach, Virginia, and always wanted to create art. During grades 4-8 he was enrolled in the Old Donation Center for the Gifted and Talented, and in high school he continued his study of art at the Governor's School for the Arts. He moved to Richmond, Virginia, to study in the Communication Arts Department at Virginia Commonwealth University, which is ranked in the top three art schools in the country. While at VCU, he received multiple awards for his artistic and academic achievement, including: Most Outstanding Junior and Senior in Communication Arts, Dean's List, and a scholarship from the New York Society of Illustrators' Student Competition.

After he received his B.F.A. in 2006, Daniel started to teach drawing and painting as an adjunct faculty member in the Communication Arts Department. He has also exhibited his paintings in galleries in New York, Virginia, North Carolina, Charleston, Boston, and Park City, Utah. Daniel has received numerous honors and awards including: Award of Excellence from the Portrait Society of America's 2014 International Portrait Competition; Best in Show at the "Virginia Artists Juried Exhibition," in


Hampton, Virginia; Virginia's Finest Artist at the "Boardwalk Art Festival," in Virginia Beach, Virginia; Winsor and Newton Material Award at the Salmagundi Club in New York City; and he wrote "The Road Not Taken" for the Artists on Art publication. His thoughts on his work:

In my work I explore the world around me. Art gives me the opportunity to analyze both the physical properties and psychological effects of my subjects. I focus on the honest experience of seeing. I do not observe something simply as unique or beautiful, but allow my mind to think, question, and respond intellectually to the subject. To focus on beauty alone denies both artist and viewer the full experience of observation and intelligent response. My art represents this process of seeing. The final result of the work is not a representation of one idea, but a multilayered response spawned from repeated observation.

Daniel Robbins continues to live, work, and teach in Richmond, Virginia.

The Golf Pro Shop is moving upstairs this year; it is planned to begin renovations to an old storage room as well as the Rose Room in February. Your entire JRCC Golf Team awaits its arrival and the opportunity to serve you and your guests like never before. Once completed, we encourage you to utilize the new bag drop to help us provide first class service from our Member Service Specialists.

Your JRCC Golf Team has finished its planning for the 2019 season. Each staff member was asked to write down five things we did well, five things we could do better and five things they would like to see added to improve our service to our membership and guests. Golf & Grounds Maintenance Report

Steven C. Suttle, Chairman Report by Rob Wilmans, Director of Golf & Grounds Maintenance

anuary was a great month of golf Jweather; it was nice to see some busy days compared to last year. Timing of rain events, unfortunately, have prevented the course from ever really drying out. This time of year, with the turf being dormant and the trees not growing we just stay wet in a lot of areas. As a grounds staff, we are trying our best to get the carts off of the paths as much as possible. A little cooperation from Mother Nature would make this possible. We continue the deep aeration project and it is really making an impact on our soil moisture. The amount of wet areas we have are decreasing and the firmness of the course after surface water moves off is much improved. Most

of the course is firm enough to walk on without leaving footprints, unlike many other courses in our area.

The grounds staff has worked hard all month picking up the rest of the leaves from the turf areas, blowing out the landscape beds and removing that debris as well. We are working on pruning back much of the plant material to keep the desired shape and size. Some time is being spent locating all of the irrigation heads and valves on the property so we can edge them and be able find them when we need to. Drainage repair work was started on 13 this month as we began digging up sunken catch basins, finding the malfunction, repairing then back-filling the area. This drain line runs anywhere from four to six feet below the ground. It is a time consuming project, but a high priority. On bad weather days we continue to work on refurbishing tee markers, ball washers and benches, as well as annual maintenance on our operations facility. A well-maintained property begins by taking care of our work area!

February brings the Golf Industry Show, which is an educational conference and trade show for golf maintenance. This is one last chance to get some education and keep up to date with the latest technology before we begin the bunker project. The start date is slated for Monday, February 11, and I could not be any more excited!


